Welcome & Call to Order

Chair Fredman called the meeting to order at 12:02 p.m. ET.

Roll Call

Review and Adoption of the Agenda

Review and Adopt Minutes

Guest Speaker Jeff Rosa

- Jeff shared the spreadsheet used by the PT Compact to track compliance.
- The focus of PT compliance is on data sharing and the rules governing the data system. PT has set a goal of achieving 90 percent compliance with data sharing from their member states.
- One of the main challenges faced by PT is a hesitancy among states to report
 potential actions before a final decision is made. This reluctance often stems from
 the absence of a prior step in the compact or legal advice to withhold preliminary
 information. Jeff indicated that this may continue to be a compliance challenge
 moving forward.
- PT is working to implement a unique identifier that is not a Social Security number. They are exploring the use of Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) identifiers, when available.
- The PT compliance committee emphasizes that their role is not punitive, but rather focused on collaborating with member states to improve compliance.

Review and Discussion of PSYPACT Data
